



Safety-, Health- and Occupational Health Policy

- Managers' responsibilities are clear and employees know that their safety is always a priority.
- Continuous improvements are being made in safety, health and occupational health issues.
- Encourage and empower employees to adopt a healthy lifestyle.

Ways to meet the policy objectives

- The safety, health and occupational health policy is reviewed annually.
- Incidents related to safety, health and occupational health issues are recorded and investigated for prevention purposes.
- Safety Committee is in place to deal with safety issues and a Crisis Committee manages the response to larger disasters.
- Emergency response plans are available and are practiced according to contingency plans.

The CEO is responsible for the maintenance and review of the policy. The Quality Manager is responsible for ensuring that the company's employees are familiar with the policy.
